SUMMARY: The Ojibwemowin Lead Apprentice will gain the experience of organizing, maintaining, and creating materials used to integrate Ojibwemowin and culture into Early learning programs.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Incorporate and assess Ojibwemowin in Migiizinsag and KBOCC Daycare classrooms
- Clerical and administrative support tasks including, but not limited to, file maintenance, data recording, and special projects that relate to Ojibwemowin and culture
- Creating and managing inventory used to integrate Ojibwa language and culture
- Preparing or creating flyers, brochures, and website with updated information or cultural events
- Assist with family literacy projects
- Tutoring
- Provide guidance to Ojibwemowin Apprentice Assistant
